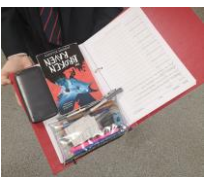

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# HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE YEAR SO FAR...

## Yate Academy Rewards System

Students receive positive points for in-class merits and for signatures on the positive side of their character card. Students are then eligible for rewards based upon this:

### Weekly Rewards

Sweets / chocolate for top 10 positive point winners each week, this is recognised and celebrated weekly in roll call.

Tub of celebrations for the top tutor group each week based on positive points.

Dominos pizza celebration lunch for 10 students in each year group selected at random from the top 50 students in each year group.

### Fortnightly Rewards

Prize draw with 10-15 prizes to win include £20 gift vouchers and takeaway vouchers – entry to this is based on students having no negative points and 100% attendance in the previous two weeks.

### Ongoing Rewards

Half termly Bronze (200 points) Silver (300 points) , Gold (400 points) achievement badges/certificates issued half termly based on total positive points. All students with a badge are eligible to collect a treat every Tuesday break time as an ongoing reward.

### Half Termly Rewards

Gold, Silver and Bronze reward events based on based on total half termly positive points and no AR's. This half term these have been as follows:

- o Gold – Ice Skating Trip – Top 50 student
- o Silver – Pizza Lunch – 100 students
- o Bronze – Cinema Experience – 250 students

## Year 7 CPR Training

All of our year 7 students participated in workshops to train them in CPR and how to use a defibrillator machine. This was run by the Great Western Air Ambulance Charity (you may have seen their helicopter landing in the school grounds last year) with 3 paramedics who volunteer on their days off to facilitate these sessions. They brought manikin dummies and non live Defibrillators to practice heart massages and rescue breaths. A great life skill practiced and learnt!

They had the opportunity to work with several of their recent graduates and to meet one of their directors, Claire Wallin. They were taken on an office tour to meet the staff and then gathered back in the rooftop events area where they participated in 2 workshops, one on increasing diversity within the workplace and one on developing ideas around sustainable travel, both of which they had to present their ideas back to the group. Well done to some of our Year 10 and 11 students who completed their Duke of Edinburgh qualifying expedition! Great teamwork and resilience shown by all.

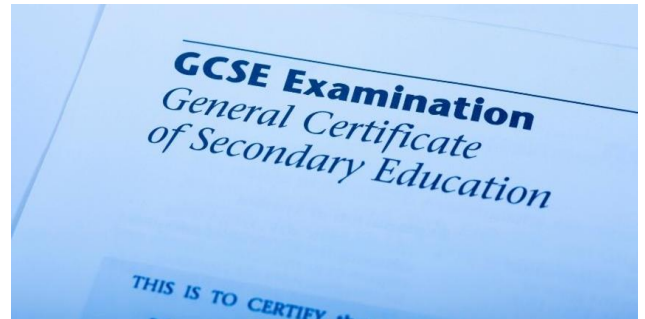


## Royal Navy – Ready, Steady Cook

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# SPORTING HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE YEAR SO FAR...

Well done to all the students who have represented the Academy this term in Rugby, Football, Netball, X Country and Athletics.

This term we became Yate Rugby clubs first schools partner, as part of the partnership Yate have provided coaches to support the Academy rugby programme, running training for year 7 and 8 boys, these sessions averaged 35 year 7 and 8 boys per session. As part of the agreement all students from Yate Academy can join and play for the club for free, staff at the Academy will also be invited to attend CPD sessions delivered by Bristol Bears coaches. The quality of the rugby has been outstanding and has been reflected in the performances of the boys in fixtures and tournaments. Year 7 has been the most successful, only losing one game all season. It has been great to see a number of boys joining Chipping Sodbury and Yate Rugby clubs and others joining the Bristol Bears programme.

37 students in years 7-10 have represented the Academy in X Country matches at Downend and Bradley Stoke and the X Country Championships at Pomphrey Hill. Notable performances came from Ava S finishing 8th in the Championship Race and Charlie W finishing first in every single race both gaining selection for the South Gloucestershire team to compete at the Avon Schools X Country Championships in January, where they will compete against the best runners from Bristol, Bath and North Somerset.

Netball club on Tuesdays has been fantastic this term with 45+ students regularly attending. Students have had excellent results in their fixtures against some of our local schools and it has been great to see so many girls representing Yate Academy. Netball club will be continuing after Christmas with friendly games being organised. It has been great to see the development of our students in this club.

We have had an impressive start to our girls football club and fixtures. On Friday 17th November we took 16 Y7/8 girls to the EFL Girls Cup Road to Wembley Tournament hosted by Bristol Rovers FC. The girls played fantastically on the day, both teams were successful in getting through to the quarter finals. One of the teams made it through to the finals and became runners up, it was a very close game with the girls narrowly missing out on 1st place when the game ended in penalties.

Y7 and 8 Girls had a football tournament on Thursday 7th December playing against 4 local schools. The Y7 team won 2 games and drew 1 and the Y8 team won 3 games and drew 1. They all played fantastically despite the cold and rain. We are looking forward to more football fixtures after Christmas.

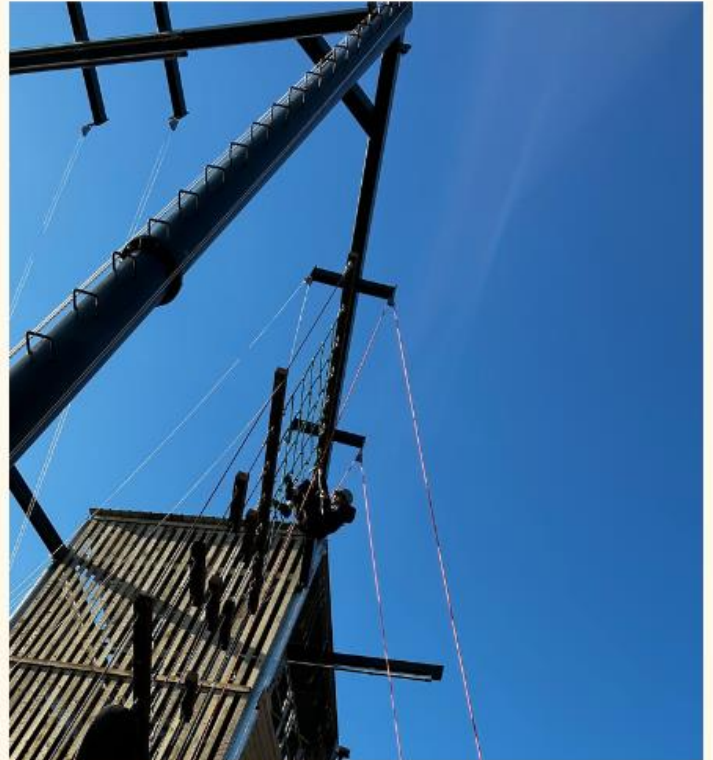

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# ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

## The Holiday activities and Food (HAF) programme :

The HAF programme is for children and young people aged 5 to 16 who receive benefits-related free school meals. Before booking funded HAF places, you need to have successfully applied for free school meals at [www.southglos.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals](http://www.southglos.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals)

Please follow these steps:

- Visit [www.southglos.gov.uk/HAF](http://www.southglos.gov.uk/HAF) for full information on the HAF programme and further support available to families.
- Click on '**book a space for your child now**' – this will take you directly to our booking platform with full listings of all the available activities and clubs.
- You will need to **register your child on this system** unless they attended a HAF programme over the summer holidays – in which case you will already have an account, so you will simply need to book the dates.
- The system will run an eligibility check to ensure that your child is registered on our benefits-related free school meals list. The list is kept up to date on a weekly basis, so it's best to build in time to apply for benefits-related free school meals ahead of booking HAF places.
- The booking system is mobile friendly so should be accessible to most families. If you do not have online access, you will need to contact the HAF club provider directly to book places for you. Please note, if families have any queries that can't go directly to providers, please direct them to use the [HAF@southglos.gov.uk](mailto:HAF@southglos.gov.uk) mailbox.



The Tutor Reading Programme aims to promote an enjoyment of reading and allows students to access a range of literature, irrespective of reading age. Student reading comprehension is supported by the teacher's reading fluency i.e. following patterns of stress and intonation and direct vocabulary teaching. TTRP supports students in their reading, introduces students to new ideas, vocabulary and worlds, and in turn works towards improving GCSE attainment across the curriculum.

Just under 700 books have been read **since the tutor reading programme began.**
